Leadership experience:

- Academic leadership dates back to the time I worked as part of three pioneering lecturers at the newly established Midlands State University (MSU) where I was actively involved in the designing and development of the History and Development Studies (HDS) Degree Programme from scratch in 2000, followed by my appointment as Section Head of the Department of International Studies at Monash University in 2007 and then Founding Head of the Archie Mafeje Research Institute for Applied Social Policy (AMRI) (2012-2015).
- As the Founding Head on AMRI, I provided strategic leadership to the setting up of the research institute from scratch including development of strategic and operational plans, day-to-day management of its research activities, personnel, finances, and assets. I represented AMRI at the College of Graduate Studies (CGS) Executive Committee and became a member of the UNISA Senate (2012-2015). It was also during my tenure as Head of AMRI that I founded Africa Decolonial

Research Network (ADERN) which introduced decolonial thought, theory, and practice at UNISA.

- Since January 2016, I have led the Directorate of Scholarship in the newly established Department of Leadership and Transformation (DLT) at UNISA located in the Principal and Vice-Chancellor's Office and actively participated in the development of DLT Strategic and Operational Plans as well as its 'Leading Change' initiatives designed to transform the very idea of the university, scholarship, culture, systems, leadership, and communication. I led CMU in developing a clear understanding of various discourses and grammars of change such as Africanization, decolonization, indigenization, diversification, and transformation.
